The period since the Kentucky SAR Summer meeting in August has been slow in color guard activities due to the cancellation of events over concerns from the COVID-19 virus. Following is a list of the various activities the Kentucky Central Brigade color guard has supported since the Summer Meeting:

Currently no color guard events for the Kentucky Central Brigade are scheduled between the Fall State Meeting and the 2021 Spring State Meeting.

Color Guard training will again be offered in March 2021 (COVID-19 restrictions permitting) to any member of the Kentucky Society. This will be conducted in two sessions. Training with flintlock firearms will be held on one day to focus on drilling with the flintlocks and the various duties of the rifle/musket squad in a grave marking ceremony. We will also cover the safe handling and firing of the flintlocks.

It is not necessary to own your own flintlock to participate in the training. If you think at some point you will be obtaining a flintlock of your own, or you just want to know how to handle one, you are welcome to join in the training. We will have two non-firing Brown Bess flintlocks and several wooden rifles available for use during the training.

The rest of the color guard training will occur on another date to be determined. For this training we will be covering how to carry and post a flag, commands given to the color guard, dispositions of the color guard during a ceremony, giving of honors, saluting, wreath presentations, and flag folding.

All the training will be conducted indoors, so weather will not be an issue. The actual dates for the training will be announced in February 2021. If there are any questions regarding the training, please let me know.

# Service to Veterans Report

Kentucky Society SAR Fall Meeting  
14 March 2020

An amendment to the Kentucky Society By-Laws has been presented to add the Service to Veterans committee.

The deadline for submitting USS Stark Memorial reports for 2019 was 1 February. This year eight (8) Kentucky Chapters submitted reports. This is a major increase over the past several years when only 2 to 3 chapters submitted reports. The chapters that submitted reports are:

I would like to thank each of these chapters for their support of our veterans and for submitting the Stark report. Due to the work of these chapters, the total points submitted for the Kentucky Society was 87,893.

The recipients for the USS Stark Memorial awards were determined at the recent Spring Leadership meetings with the Kentucky Society being the top society in the NSSAR. In the chapters with 10-49 members, the General Richard Butler chapter placed 3<sup>rd</sup>, Col. Daniel Boone - 7<sup>th</sup>, Col. Stephen Trigg - 16<sup>th</sup>, Blue Licks chapter - 17<sup>th</sup>, Lt. Robert Moseley -19<sup>th</sup>, and the John Hardin chapter -23<sup>rd</sup> out of 43 chapters. In chapters with 50-99 members, the Simon Kenton chapter placed 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 31 chapters. In chapters with 100-199 members, the Gov. Isaac Shelby chapter placed 1<sup>st</sup> out of 18 chapters.

It should also be pointed out that the submission of the USS Stark Memorial reports is about more than winning awards. When chapters submit their report it allows the Kentucky Society to identify where the strengths and weaknesses lie in our service to veterans programs. We can also identify which chapters have strong programs in certain areas which will allow other chapters to learn from their programs.

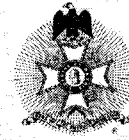

The following is a summary of activities by the Colonel John Hardin Chapter for Calendar Year 2020:

January - DAR and SAR Compatriots met with Mayor Gregory of Elizabethtown, Ky and Hardin County Government Vice-Judge-Executive Dan London to plan and discuss the arrangements for the American Revolution Patriots Memorial.

DAR and SAR Compatriots participated in the Religious Freedom event at the Pritchard Community Center in Elizabethtown in conjunction with state and local officials to celebrate President Jefferson's declaration of religious freedom in Virginia.

Compatriot Humphries met several occasions with Cecilia Bank Officials to request financial support for the American Revolution Patriots Memorial (ARPM).

DAR and SAR Compatriots met with Elizabethtown Tourism Board to request support for the ARPM and to plan integration activities for the project. It is the vision of the DAR and SAR to make the ARPM a centerpiece for educational activities in Hardin and surrounding counties in the future.

DAR and SAR Compatriots gave an ARPM presentation to the Elizabethtown Noon Rotary members to request their support and to explain the project.
